Professor James Tumwine



James Tumwine, MD, is Professor of Public Health at Makerere University in Uganada. Formerly Oxfam UK's health adviser for the Africa region, Professor Tumwine is a specialist in paediatric infectious diseases. In 2001, he launched a new journal for research on health and development, *African Health Sciences*. Professor Tumwine is chairman of the Forum of African Medical Editors (FAME), a forum that grew out of a WHO meeting in 2002 that explored ways to improve the quality and dissemination of African medical journals.

Professor Cantalupo, PhD, is Professor of English, Comparative Literature and African Studies at the Penn State University. Professor Cantalupo has received numerous teaching, research and achievement awards and has been extensively published. He is co-author of the “Asmara Declaration on African Languages and Literatures,” and he serves as organizing chair of *Against All Odds: African Languages and Literatures into the 21st Century* (Eritrea) and *Buwa: African Languages and Literatures into the 21st Century* (South Africa).
