RESOLUTION  
 ON THE RETIREMENT OF  
 DR. WILLIAM FRANK WYATT  
 ADOPTED BY THE  
 FACULTY OF ARTS AND SCIENCES  
 MARCH 11, 1957

In June, 1956, Dr. William Frank Wyatt, Emeritus Professor of Greek, completed forty-two years of active service at Tufts. Professor Wyatt's exact knowledge of Greek and other languages, his broad learning, and his ever-inquiring mind have made his career memorable to students and colleagues alike. In his teaching he displayed to a remarkable degree the best qualities of native scholarship: honesty, vitality, and love of truth. With modest assurance and quiet candor, Professor Wyatt taught more than his subject; patient of ignorance but never of folly, sympathetic but exacting, he induced his pupils, as he did his friends, to regard life as education and education as life, making good judgment the test of success in either. Both in the School of Religion and in the undergraduate divisions of the University, Professor Wyatt's courses have enlivened and enriched the minds and attitudes of Tufts and Jackson students for almost half a century. The Faculty of Arts and Sciences records its appreciation and conveys to Professor Wyatt its very best wishes for a fruitful and happy retirement.
