The Research & Statistics Group at the Federal Reserve Bank of New York conducts long and short-term research and provides analytic support for the Bank's responsibilities relating to monetary policy, banking supervision, payments systems, funding facilities and other economic and financial issues. In addition to contributing to the formulation and execution of policy in these areas, independent research is conducted on a wide range of topics such as: the links between financial markets and the macroeconomy, structural and financial issues affecting the health of U.S. and foreign banks and banking systems; risks associated with the international flow of payments among large financial institutions; technical aspects of domestic macroeconomics and microeconomic issues; projections of U.S. economic activity and the federal budget; and issues related to international finance and trade and the macroeconomics policies of major foreign economies.

Responsibilities:

- Assist economists in planning and executing short term policy projects and long-term research on a wide range of topics from applied to theoretical.
- Write memos and presentations on current economic and financial conditions and policy issues.
- Perform advanced econometric, computational, and analytical research intended for publication in leading academic journals.
- Run financial, banking, macroeconomic, international forecasting models and programs in statistical packages such as SAS, STATA, or Matlab.
- Compile, review, and assess information from academic journals, market sources, and government reports.
- Develop spreadsheets/web macros and programs to facilitate and improve data manipulation.
- Perform related duties as required.

Requirements:

- Bachelor's degree in Economics, Mathematics, Statistics or related field.
 - Demonstrated experience in using large databases and statistical packages (Stata, Matlab, SAS, Gauss, TSP, RATS, PROCSQL).
 - Strong analytical abilities.
 - Ability to provide effective verbal and written analysis.
 - Ability to meet strict deadlines and work cooperatively in a team environment.
 - Proficiency in MS Office Suite.
 - Knowledge of LaTeX is a plus.
- Cover letter, unofficial transcript and a writing sample are required as part of your submission.

Candidates must be eligible to work in the U.S. on a continuous basis for other than practical training purposes.

In some cases, positions require access to confidential supervisory information, which is limited to "Protected Individuals" as defined in the U.S. federal immigration law. Protected Individuals include, but are not limited to, U.S. citizens, U.S. nationals, U.S. permanent residents who are not yet eligible to apply for naturalization, and U.S. permanent residents who have applied for naturalization within six months of being eligible to do so.
