

## WERTLIEB FELLOWSHIP IN GLOBAL HEALTH

This fellowship, established in 2011 to honor Professor Donald Wertlieb, is meant to facilitate the preparation of graduate students in the Eliot-Pearson Department of Child Development who are planning to enter the field of global child or family health. The \$2,500 award is to be used to support travel, fieldwork, or other relevant activities that will supplement the coursework available at Eliot-Pearson, and enhance the awardee's capstone internship experience.

### ELIGIBILITY

The following criteria must be met by applicants for this fellowship:

- ⊕ Student is currently enrolled, in good standing, in the MA Applied degree program.
- ⊕ Student has completed **six** courses, or will be enrolled and complete a sixth course before the fellowship begins;
- ⊕ Student's course of study reflects a clear interest in global child and/or family health;
- ⊕ Student can clearly articulate a proposed project and its relevance to previous coursework and eventual capstone internship.

### APPLICATION PROCESS

The application should contain the following elements:

- ⊕ A completed application face sheet, available in hard copy or electronically from Ms. Rita Bartolomeu in the Eliot-Pearson office (rita.bartolomeu@tufts.edu).
- ⊕ A concise description (1,000 words, maximum) of the proposed project that contains:
  - Its goals – what benefits the student expects to derive;
  - Its specifics – where and when it will occur, what the nature of the experience will be, a contact person at the site, a field supervisor (if appropriate), an estimated budget, etc.
  - How it builds on, and integrates, prior coursework and field experiences;
- ⊕ A brief endorsement from the student's faculty program advisor;
- ⊕ A copy of the student's Eliot-Pearson transcript to date.

The completed application should be submitted in hard copy to Prof. Marina Bers, Chair, Masters Program Committee, by **noon, March 30, 2012**. The successful applicant will be notified by **April 13, 2012**, and the award will be conferred at the Eliot-Pearson Commencement on **May 20, 2012**.

### TERMS OF THE FELLOWSHIP

The terms of the award include:

- ⊕ The fellowship must be completed by **December 31, 2012**;
- ⊕ A report (~5 pages) that reflects back on the student's goals, describes the actual experience (often there is some variation between what is proposed and what is undertaken), and explores its place in preparing the student for related professional work, is expected within one month of its completion.
- ⊕ A brief presentation at the Eliot-Pearson Fall (2012) Orientation, and at Student Presentation Day in the spring, 2013, is also expected.
