



How to Determine Amount of Funding You Must Show in Order to Get Your Immigration Document

- Subtract any tuition scholarship from your tuition charge (see Estimate of Expenses Form) to get **TOTAL A**
- Subtract any teaching or research assistantship from your living expenses to get **TOTAL B**
- **TOTAL A + TOTAL B** = Remaining amount you must demonstrate in US dollars, using original documents, in order to get your immigration document.

EXAMPLE ONE:

Masters student in the Graduate School of Arts & Sciences with NO Tuition Scholarship, Teaching or Research Assistantship:

Tuition and Fee Charge:	\$41,248	Living Expenses:	\$21,299
Tuition Scholarship:	<u>-\$ 0</u>	TA/RA/GA.:	<u>-\$ 0</u>
TOTAL A	\$41,248	TOTAL B	\$21,299

\$41,248 (TOTAL A) plus \$21,299(TOTAL B) = \$62,547 (Amount to demonstrate you have or are being sponsored for.)

EXAMPLE TWO:

PhD student in the Graduate School of Arts & Sciences with a Teaching Assistantship for \$15,000 for one academic year and a full tuition scholarship.

Tuition and Fee Charge:	\$24,764	Living Expenses:	\$ 18,858
Tuition Scholarship:	<u>- 24,724</u>	TA/RA/GA.:	<u>\$-15,000</u>
TOTAL A:	\$ 40	TOTAL B:	\$ 3,858

\$40 (TOTAL A) plus \$3,858 (TOTAL B) = \$3,898(Amount to demonstrate you have or are being sponsored for.)

Please note: not all students will receive a tuition scholarship and/or a Teaching or Research Assistantship.
