Please follow the instructions below, fill out the form in its entirety (including student/advisor signatures), and return it to the IR Office (Packard Hall, Ground Floor) before it goes to Dowling Hall. General instructions/policies:

- **12 courses required (core and thematic concentration) plus completion of the IR language requirement.**
- **No major course may be taken Pass/Fail.**
- **Minimum grade of C- is required in all courses** counted toward the completion of major.
- **If you have more than one major**, please see *Bulletin* for rules on double-counting courses.
- **If you have a minor**, no more than two course credits used toward the minor may be used toward foundation, distribution, major, or other minor requirements.
- **Do not leave any line blank.** If a course is “to be taken,” please indicate that with the future semester.
- **Mark transfer courses** (including Tufts Programs Abroad) with a “T” before the title of the course. Only 3 courses from abroad are permitted (only 1 of which can be used for Core.) Transfer courses must be approved by Tufts and the IR Program.
- Please see Program Website for complete International Relations major requirements/policies.

More about the Thematic Concentration section:

- Make sure you indicate your thematic concentration on the form.
- **All thematic concentrations require a minimum of 7 courses**, but some may require 8 if all the requirements are not met with 7.
- **At least 4 of the thematic concentration courses must be non-intro level** (* on website).
- In the column “TC Requirement,” please list the requirement(s) that each of the 7 courses fulfills. See the reference chart below for requirements by TC.
- **Double Counting Policy:** One course may fulfill more than one thematic concentration requirement. For example, a history seminar satisfies both the history AND the capstone requirement, but a total of 7 courses is still required.
- Courses used for the core and/or the language requirements may not be used for the thematic concentration requirements.
