

IMPORTANT NOTE: This concentration is ONLY available up to and including the Class Year of 2019.

OLD TC6A: IDEOLOGIES

This concentration addresses the central role played by ideologies and other group affinities in shaping the sub-national, national and transnational dynamics of international relations. Courses in this concentration must foreground how ideas, in shaping and mobilizing identities, bear upon international affairs. Students can choose one of two sub-concentrations, the first focusing on the theoretical dimension, and the second on its actualization on a global scale.

Requirements

In addition to the 5 Core Requirements and the IR Language Requirement, students must take **a total of 7 courses to complete their Thematic Concentration**. No more than 3 of the 7 courses may be an introductory level course (marked with *).

TC6A Requirements are as follows:

- **2 social science courses**
- **1 history course**
- **1 culture course**
- **1 course on the role of the U.S. in the world** (Note: Students in TC6A may alternatively choose any course approved for the Old TC5 U.S. in World Affairs concentration to fulfill the U.S. Role requirement.)
- **1 research methods course** (See the [Courses](#) page for a list of approved courses.)
- **1 capstone course** (A capstone course is an upper level seminar course, senior honors thesis, or directed research. See the [Capstone](#) page for more information.)

Note: It is possible that **a single course may satisfy more than one concentration requirement**. For example, *REL 36 Global Christianity* would satisfy both the history and the culture requirements. **If students complete the above requirements with fewer than 7 courses**, they can choose any additional courses from the concentration to reach the required 7 total courses.

Frequently Asked Questions

- If a course is approved for both a Core and TC6A, can I double count it? **NO**
- If a course is approved for both my TC6A culture requirement and one of my IR language semesters, can I double count it? **NO**
