



OUR COLLECTIVE IMPACT

Rhode Island and Massachusetts Campus Compacts (RICC and MACC) were awarded highly competitive Learn and Serve Higher Education funds over a three-year grant cycle, beginning in September 2006. The consortia grant supports 16 institutions of higher education in both states focused on creating strategic and sustainable campus-community partnerships focused on the needs of disadvantaged youth in the region. A second component of the grant is focused on supporting faculty in both states through a Faculty Fellowship Program. The fellowship provides funding for faculty to participate in a program that supports their development and growth as leaders and campus organizers around issues of youth development and service-learning curriculum construction. Through Year 2 of our grant, great progress has been made toward meeting, and in some instances, exceeding annual performance measure goals. The following data has been compiled from annual LASSIE and program progress reports.
