**TAPPING INTO SOCIAL  
INNOVATION: INVOLVING  
STUDENTS IN THE ACTION**

**NOVEMBER 19, 2009

**TOPIC:** In this webinar you will learn the fundamentals of social innovation and social entrepreneurship and the strategies to engage students in this work. The webinar will investigate connections with community asset development, micro enterprise development, green collar jobs, and local community-based economic recovery. After an overview, we will discuss successful examples of how college faculty and students have been instrumental as social entrepreneurs. Example projects will include building local assets for working families, access to credit for micro businesses and capacity building for grassroots organizations.

**CO-FACILITATORS:** *Corinn Williams* is the Director and Co-Founder of the Community Economic Development Center of Southeastern Massachusetts (CEDC) located in New Bedford, Massachusetts. Williams has been involved in creating economic opportunities using creative strategies in numerous community development programs and efforts to support local micro businesses, providing training for jobseekers, adults and youth as well providing a wide range of support services to the immigrant community including tax preparation and English classes. She received her B.A. at Southeastern Massachusetts University and an M.A. and ABD in Economic Anthropology at the University of Connecticut.

*Deirdre Healy* is the Director for the Office of Community Service and Partnerships at the University of Massachusetts Dartmouth. As a Peace Corps Volunteer she worked with a micro-lending organization and through AmeriCorps she became familiar with the foundations and concepts around social entrepreneurship. At UMass Dartmouth she encourages students to think creatively to solve social problems as part of their service-learning projects. Healy is a social entrepreneur herself as the co-founder of the Fairhaven Massachusetts Sustainability Committee. Healy received her Bachelors degree in Business from the University of New Hampshire and Master's in Public Policy from UMass Dartmouth.
