ANTHROPOLOGY MAJOR INSTRUCTIONS AND POLICIES

- Eleven courses required
- A minimum of 50% of courses counted toward the anthropology major must be completed at the Tufts University home campus or in Tufts University sponsored programs abroad.
- A maximum of two cross-listed courses offered by other Tufts departments may be counted toward the Anthropology major.
- Students must achieve a grade of C- or better for a course to count for credit toward the major.
- We recommend taking the theory course (Anthropology 130) in the junior year and the ethnographic methods course (Anthropology 161) prior to the senior year.
- If you have more than one major, please see Bulletin for rules on double-counting courses.
- If you have a minor, no more than two course credits used toward the minor may be used toward foundation, distribution, major, or other minor requirements.
