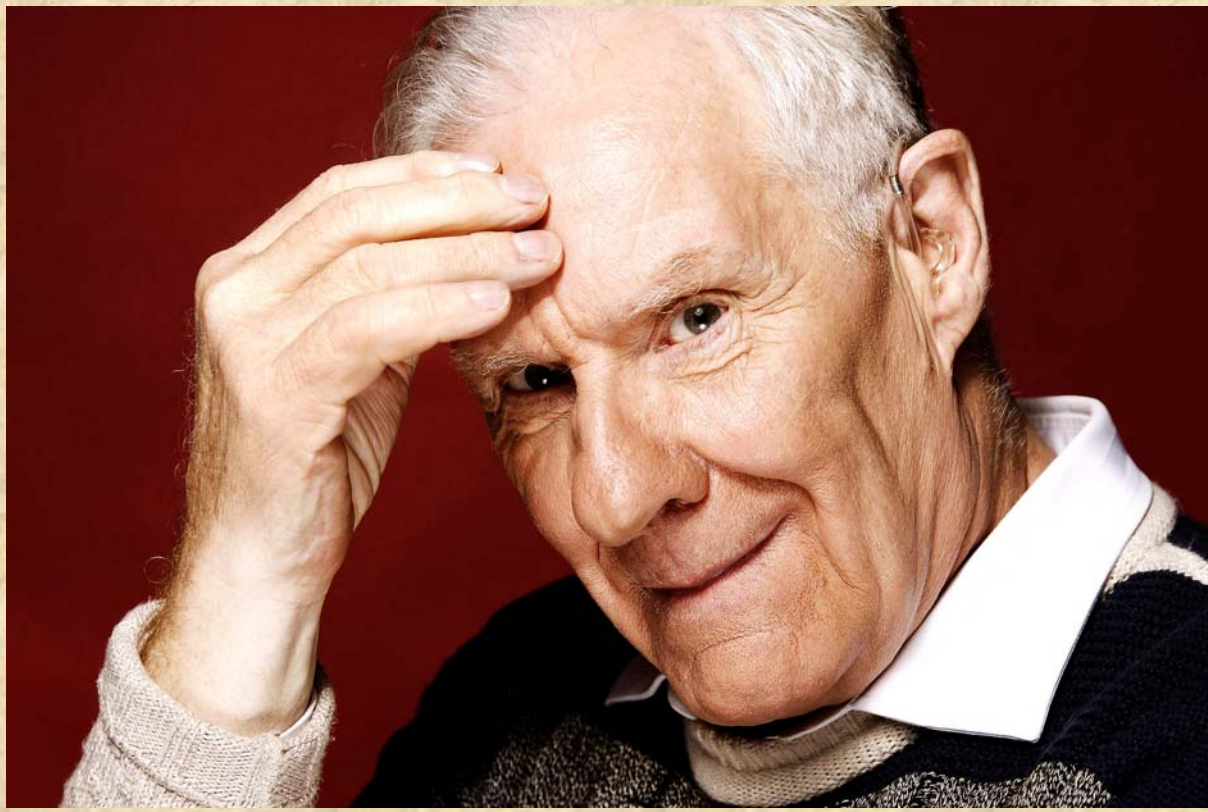


ALAIN BADIOU



Alain Badiou is one of the most important and influential philosophers in the world today. Emeritus professor of philosophy at the École normale supérieure in Paris, he is also a novelist, playwright, and political activist. His major books of philosophy are *Theory of the Subject* (1982; English translation 2009), *Being and Event* (1988; English translation 2005), *Logics of Worlds* (2006; English translation 2009), and *The Immanence of Truths*, now in progress. He has also published dozens of books and innumerable articles on politics, film, literature, music, ethics, mathematics, and many other topics.
