

MINOR IN CHINESE

(Updated November, 2015)

The minor requires 6 courses beyond Chinese 4 with grades of C or above, including two 100-level language courses and at least two **literature/culture** courses. There are three combinations of six courses from which students can choose from. Please see below. Only one **literature/culture** course taken at a non-Tufts program will be accepted toward the minor. Students going abroad for non-Tufts programs should discuss with the Chinese Program's director, prior to their departure, whether or not a course will be accepted as a literature/culture course after they return from studying abroad. Students should discuss with the Program their intentions to minor no later than the fall semester of their senior year.

Note:

1. No more than 2 courses fulfilling a foundation, distribution, or concentration requirement can be used to fulfill minor requirements. Asian Studies (Chinese) majors are thus advised that since Chinese 21, 22, 121, and 122 count towards their major, they need to choose within the following parameters: i/ 2-4 language courses from 121-128, ii/ 4-2 lit/culture courses that are not used to fulfill their major requirements.
2. Students should declare their intention to minor no later than the spring semester of their junior year.
