ILVS MAJOR INSTRUCTIONS AND POLICIES

World Literature Track

- Twelve courses plus a senior project or an honors thesis are required.
- Tufts Foreign Language Requirement, though the study of a foreign language up to the eighth semester (122 or equivalent) is highly recommended. One could place out of this requirement by passing a placement test beyond the 122 level. In that case, starting a new language is highly recommended.
- The gate-way to the world literature track is ILVS 60: Intro to Literary and Cultural Studies or approved substitute.
- Sophomores usually have only a vague idea of their Intellectual Focus when they sign up, but it is important to have a guiding interest that informs course selection. It is crucial that this idea develops by the junior year, so that it might bear fruit during the senior year as a topic for a project or thesis.
- French and Spanish 31 and 32 are literature surveys and can count as literature courses.
- Two courses can be hands-on courses, e.g., creative writing, film making, etc.
- Students must achieve a grade of C- or better for a course to count for credit toward the major.
- No major course may be taken Pass/Fail.
- Normally, a student must have made the Dean's list twice in order to write a senior honors thesis. A senior project can be a one semester independent study or an approved seminar paper. Thesis writers sign up for ILVS 198 and ILVS 199.
- If you have more than one major, please see Bulletin for rules on double-counting courses.
- If you have a minor, no more than two course credits used toward the minor may be used toward foundation, distribution, major, or other minor requirements.
