TC2: International Economics for Spring 2020

TC2A requires a minimum of 7 total courses to include the following: EC 11 or 16, EC 161, 1 Political Economy, 1 History, 1 Culture, 1 Research Methods, and 1 Capstone/Seminar.

TC2B requires a minimum of 7 total courses to include the following: EC 12 or 18, EC 162 or 169, 1 Political Economy, 1 History, 1 Culture, 1 Research Methods, and 1 Capstone/Seminar.

TC2C requires a minimum of 7 total courses to include the following: EC 11 or 16, EC 130, EC 30, 1 Political Economy, 1 History, 1 Culture, 1 Research Methods, and 1 Capstone/Seminar (Note: EC 130 is approved for the Seminar requirement).

TC2D requires a minimum of 7 total courses to include the following: EC 11 or 16, EC 35, EC 60 or 136, 1 Political Economy, 1 History, 1 Culture, 1 Research Methods, and 1 Capstone/Seminar (Note: EC 136 is approved for the Seminar requirement). In addition, TC2D students may use EC 35 for Core 3, but will still need a total of 7 courses to complete the thematic concentration.
